Finished size - 15"

SUPPLY LIST

Fabrics:

Background – 17" x 17" light or off-white Leaves – 1 fat quarter or 3 similar shades Stems (approx. 60" total) – Sew 1/4" wide **bias** tubes, OR Cut 3/4" wide **bias** strips

Flower Options: (Choose one or try them all.)

Multilayer – 1 fat quarter, solid or slightly mottled/shaded

Edge-ruched – 1 fat quarter, solid or slightly

mottled/shaded

Fussy cut – Yardage with at least 16 flowers more than 2-1/4" wide Broderie perse – Yardage with at least 16 round flowers approx. 2-1/4" wide Flower centers – 5" x 5"

General Supplies:

Small rotary ruler, rotary cutter and mat

Fabric scissors: sharp, pointed scissors that cut all the way to the point Paper scissors: sharp, pointed, for accurate cutting of freezer paper Applique needle

Threads to match your appliqué fabrics, white or light color thread for basting Embroidery needle

Embroidery floss, yellow, gold, brown

Freezer paper approx. 8" x 10"

Ball Point Pins (Dritz® Size 17, 1-1/16" recommended)

Water-soluble gluestick or washable basting glue

Mechanical pencil

Fine-point washable blue marker

Lightbox

Foamcore board approx. 8" square or larger
